This is a simple way to make a real difference to the life of a child at Christmas. Can you find the time to fill a shoe box with a few inexpensive gifts? Last year our boxes went to children in Liberia, Belarus and Ukraine. HARVEST FESTIVAL AT ECO CHURCH This week we invite you, as part of your Harvest response, to explore your own (individual or household) carbon footprint using a simple questionnaire to give you a feel for your contribution to the national carbon footprint. This questionnaire from WWF takes about 5 min to complete. We urge you to be honest and see how large or small is your current footprint. How important and relevant this now is in the light of the report this week from the International Panel on Climate Change that we all need to change our lifestyles.

Make a record of the result and send it in to the office by email or phone by the end of the month. We will average the responses for the church community. The WWF website gives some suggestions about how to reduce your footprint and we shall be giving some hints from time to time through the year. In 12 months, we will repeat the exercise see how effective our measures have been to reduce our church carbon footprint.
